The South Australian Public Primary Schools Choir Annual Report 2024

Background Information:

In 2024, the SAPPS Choir team consisted of Cathy Lange, Conductor, Stephanie Eaton, Assistant Conductor, Cheryl Clark, Accompanist, Chad Lofts, IT Support and Joanne Kay, Administrator. Director of Music, Robyn Filmer was also involved in some rehearsals and the recording of the 2025 repertoire.

The choir was strongly supported, as always, by members of the Primary Schools Music Festival Office.

We began the year with 43 students. We had students representing schools from all over the Adelaide Metropolitan Area.

Fees:

The **fees** remained at \$250 per child and \$125 for school card holders and concurrent second child from one family.

The music levy was \$40 and is fully refunded at the end of the year to families where all sheet music is returned in good condition.

We rehearsed and performed with the Adelaide Youth Orchestra's Junior String Ensemble for a highly successful biannual collaboration with AdYO.

Our Winter Concert was delayed until early in Term 3 due to staff availability.

It was decided that the SAPPS Choir students in Year 6 would again be offered the opportunity to continue in 2025 and a number of these students chose to continue.

Of those eligible, twenty students in total chose to continue.

Post covid, our numbers have been comparatively low, so a concerted effort was made to spread the word, far and wide, about our annual auditions In November. This proved to be very successful with numbers for 2025 starting at 56, which is the highest number of choir members since Covid. The Twilight Christmas Concert was a wonderful celebration of a highly successful year, and we finished the year with a social event for the students, Bowling and Laser Tag, which was very well attended and enjoyed by our students.

Throughout the year the choir continued to be supported at rehearsals by Chad Lofts, particularly around vision and IT. A download of the year's events was once again compiled and offered to families.

The Festival team also provided wonderful support to the SAPPS Choir, always willing to support and help in the office, at rehearsals and gigs if required.

We had a small but enthusiastic parent group who assisted at performances, organised a Kytons fundraiser and raffles at both of our concerts, and helped with the music collection and sorting. All our SAPPS Choir families were supportive and appreciative of the opportunities provided for their children.

At the end of 2024 Stephanie Eaton was granted 12 months leave of absence and will return in 2025.

The Music Society continues to provide their greatly appreciated financial support, (without which we could not exist), and encouragement to provide the diverse range of performance opportunities available to our students.
