# The South Australian Public Primary Schools Choir Annual Report 2023

## **Background Information:**

In 2023 we welcomed a new Conductor, Stephanie Eaton, replacing Gaby Freer, in the role of Assistant Conductor.

The SAPPS Choir team consisted of Cathy Lange, Conductor, Stephanie Eaton, Assistant Conductor, Cheryl Clark, Accompanist, Chad Lofts, IT Support and Joanne Kay, Administrator.

Director of Music, Robyn Filmer was also involved in some rehearsals and the recording of the 2024 repertoire.

The choir was strongly supported, as always, by members of the Primary Schools Music Festival Office.

We began the year with 45 students. We had students representing schools from all over the Adelaide Metropolitan area and one country student attending from Kapunda.

#### Fees:

The **fees** remained at \$250 per child and \$125 for school card holders and concurrent second child from one family.

The music levy was \$40 and was fully refunded at the end of the year to families where all sheet music was returned in good condition.

A highlight of the first semester was the celebration of the 20<sup>th</sup> year of the SAPPS Choir. Contact was made with as many SAPPS Choir alumni as possible, with an invitation extended to jointly perform with the current SAPPS Choir members.

Under the direction of one of the inaugural conductors, David Jackson, they performed Africa, accompanied by Robyn Filmer, who had previously been a SAPPS Choir Accompanist and Administrator.

An Afternoon Tea with 20 Year Celebration cupcakes was served after the concert.

Twilight Christmas Concert, Burnside City Uniting Church.

We had multiple performances at the Adelaide Festival Theatre, with a diverse range and style, from the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Festival Theatre, to a Pink Floyd Tribute Concert and our own Festival of Music Guest Artist.

An opportunity for some of our students to perform in front of an international guest list and sing from the roof of the Adelaide Oval, was a unique experience and an incredible highlight for the students and families.

It was decided that current SAPPS Choir students in Year 6 would again be offered the opportunity to continue in 2024. Some students took up this opportunity.

In November we held auditions for students in Years 5 and 6, producing a starting number of 46 for 2024.

The Twilight Christmas Concert was a wonderful celebration of a highly successful year and the year finished with a social event at Bounce, which was very well attended.

Throughout the year the choir continued to be supported at rehearsals by Chad Lofts, particularly around vision and IT. A download of the year's events was once again compiled and offered to families at a cost of \$10 per download. This proved popular.

The Festival team also provided wonderful support to the SAPPS Choir, always willing to support and help in the office, at rehearsals and gigs if required.

We had a small but enthusiastic parent group who assisted at performances, organised a Kytons Bakery fundraiser and raffles at both of our concerts, and helped with the music collection and sorting.

All of our SAPPS Choir families were supportive and appreciative of the opportunities provided for their children.

The Music Society continues their much appreciated financial support and encouragement of the choir, without which we could not exist.
